The wastewater department will continue to cover the sewer loan payments that exceed the economic tax collected, therefore, the sewer fund will reflect a deficit again this year. With the approval of this budget, the council will have a \$7,435.00 surplus. A motion was made by Alderwoman Townsend and seconded by Alderman Allen to approve the FY 2022-2023 proposed budget as presented by City Treasurer Dennis Ross, and to allow Mr. Ross the ability to transfer money between accounts to cover deficits.
