• The Piedmont City Council met in regular session on February 14, 2023 at Piedmont City Hall. 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5. Mayor Kirkpatrick recognized Dominick Thompson, an engineer with Smith and Company of Poplar Bluff, Missouri. Mr. Thompson informed the council that a drinking water engineering report was needed to identify what issues at the (1) water treatment plant, (2) distribution lines, and (3) storage tank, pumps and telemetry (communication) repairs. Each item for the water system was quoted to cost \$7,500 apiece for a total of \$22,500. The city will not be charged until the funding for the water system has been obtained.

Alderman Allen made the motion, seconded by Alderwoman Townsend to allow Smith and Company to immediately move forward with preparing an engineering report for the items listed above but not to seek funding through DNR SRF. The motion carried.
